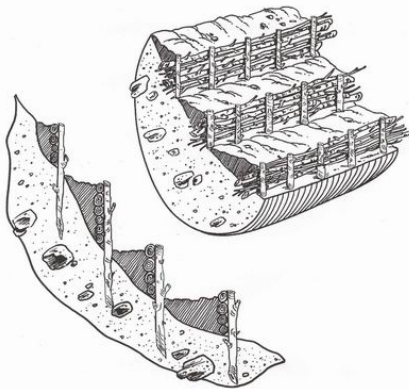




## NATURAL PROCESSES FOR THE RESTORATION OF DRASTICALLY DISTURBED SITES
